





Warm water fly fishing gear – most basic

Essential items	Nice to have
flies	cell phone (waterproof)
3X, 4X tippet	closed toe wading shoes
nippers	food & water
polarized sunglasses	sunblock & bug spray
hat	small fanny/sling pack
fishing license	C&R landing net
	neoprene wading socks
	wading staff
	Long sleeve shirt, lightweight nylon pants



Cold water fly gear (wading not boating)

Trout live in cold water, regardless of air temp

The basics: Polarized sunglasses

- Greatly reduce glare and let you see fish and the bottom
- Let's you avoid rocks, holes, snags when wading



Don't have to cost a lot; test in the store by rotating one lens against another

The basics: Waders

Modern breathable waders are made of Gore-Tex or similar

- Lightweight and waterproof without making you sweat
- Do not retain heat well
- Pin holes (thorns) are easily repaired
- Stocking foot requires wading boots, best all around choice
- Boot foot warmer in very cold water




Boot foot

The basics: Wading shoes

- Provide great grip while wading
- Protects you feet from sharp objects
- Required with stocking foot waders
- Felt and rubber sole options
- Both types can take metal studs for improved grip





For use with stocking foot waders, order one size larger.



The basics: Vest, sling bag, fanny pack








Vest	Sling bag	Fanny pack
Highest capacity	Holds just enough Range of sizes	
Can get bulky and heavy	Very comfortable	Rides low, not best for wading
Great for trouting with multiple fly boxes Great for summer wet wading Go		Good for bank and boat

The basics: Landing nets

- Not essential when wading, but very helpful in boats, canoes, kayaks, docks, piers, etc.
- Easier to control fish to remove hook
- Old style = deep with knotted bag.
- New style = shallow with coated twine or flat rubber mesh
- New style much less harmful to fish if you plan to C&R





Other essential gear - considerations

Item	Recommendation
Flies	Carry only what you need today
Fly box	One box with foam insert can hold a variety of flies (Name and phone number inside)
Tippet	4X, 5X will cover 90% of your fishing situations
Nippers	Nail clippers, cheap nippers work fine, but should be replaced when they get dull
Hat	Drab or dark colored! Not white, orange, etc.

Spend a lot or a little?



Spend a lot or a little?

My opinion: When it comes to waders, wading shoes, and fly rods, you get what you pay for.

Most high-end brands have <u>lifetime warranties</u> and excellent customer service.

Buy quality	Buy inexpensive house brands or substitutes
Fly rod & line	Nippers, shirt/pants, hats, vests, packs
Waders & boots	Fly boxes, wading staff, landing net
Tippet	
Sunglasses	
Flies/hooks	

Final thought – focus on fun

- A well-balanced rod and fly line is the most important gear
- All the rest is just to make you comfortable and safe
- You DON'T need <u>all</u> that gear to enjoy the sport
