January Program

Gary Kell, IFFF Certified Casting Instructor <u>Mastering Intermediate Casting Skills</u>

We also want to give a heads-up that the meeting in January of 2017 will be pushed back one week due to the New Year's holiday. On **January 9, 2017**, IFFF Master Certified Casting Instructor, Gary Kell will be talking about techniques and skills to improve your casting proficiency. Gary was a long-time instructor at the LL Bean Fly Fishing school, and has written for *Fly Fisherman* and other fly fishing periodicals. He lives and teaches fly fishing in the northwestern PA area, and consequently is an expert on fishing streams in central and other areas of PA. His talk will center on mastering what he calls the 5 intermediate skill variables that, when used in various combinations, create most presentation casts and solve many stream-side problems - slack line, curves, tucks, aerial mends, underbrush, limited backcast, wind etc.. More details to come about this talk, but if you want to improve your casting skills, you will not want to miss this one.

<u>February Program – Social Night Dinner</u>

Speaker: Linda Wales, from A Hope 4 Lyme, Inc.

Presentation: Lyme Disease Informational Seminar

The speaker for our **February 6** Social Night will be Linda Wales, from *A Hope 4 Lyme, Inc*. Linda, a Lyme disease warrior, will be talking about the basics of tick-borne illnesses and prevention. Lyme and other tick-borne illnesses often cause a variety of complications including pains in the muscles and joints, severe fatigue and cognitive issues. Serious health problems associated with the disease can manifest quickly, and can even be fatal. Many people don't know about the disease or that their family could be at risk. As Linda tells it, "I started spreading awareness and support because I didn't know about Lyme disease and I didn't understand or know about ticks, therefore, I got very sick. It is my hope for others to avoid going down the same path." A tick study conducted in 2016 at Mark Twain State Park and Newtown Battlefield showed almost 50% of the ticks positive for Lyme disease.


Plan Jan 27-29, 2017 to Go to the World's Largest Fly Fishing Show




Twin Tiers Five Rivers Chapter Library News

The Schminnow

Tied by Kirk Klingensmith (originally designed by Norm Zeigler)



This pattern is one of Kirk's favorites for fishing Florida. Norm Zeigler uses this fly about 90% of the time he fishes in Florida.

Materials List:

Hook: Daiichi 2456, size 2

Thread: 210 denier white

Tail: White marabou, tied in long clip off the body length.

Eyes: Large black Mono (molded plastic). Tie in and superglue to

lock in place

Body: Medium *Estaz* pearl chenille, tied in at rear of hook and

wrapped forward.

Head: Loon UV thin finish or Sally Hansen's Hard as Nails.

TF's Craft Fur Fathead Minnow

Tied by Dick Naylor (credits to American Angler Magazine)



Materials List:

Hook: Mustad S71SNP-DT, size 4.

Thread: Danville ultrafine monofilament.

Underbody: Two layers of pearl Flashabou wrapped around shank.

Body: Medium olive craft fur over medium gray craft fur on top,

with off-white craft fur on the bottom.

Cheeks: Pink craft fur

Lateral Line: Several strands of black squirrel hair and two strips of

pearl Flashabou.

Head: Size 3 *Fish-Skull*™ *Fish-Mask*. Lock in with Zap-a Gap.

Eyes: *Fish-Skull™ Ice Living Eyes*. Self-adhesive.

1. Call to Order

2. Approval of Meeting Minutes and Treasurer's Report

The Treasurer's report shows an opening balance of a \$3272.21 and a closing balance as of \$3292.21. The treasurer's report shows a discrepancy and will be reviewed again next business meeting. Dick motioned to accept business meeting minutes, Bob seconded.

3. Programming

October meeting with our own club president, Kirk Klingensmith, speaking on fishing Florida, was very well received. His tying presentation was noted as being very beneficial as well which gave insight on how to make more durable flies.

Upcoming programming includes:

- March Joe Goodspeed, from the rod company Thomas + Thomas, will be speaking on musky fishing along with demonstrating how to tie musky flies.

Program meetings have been scheduled and paid for with the Big Flats Community Center through 2017.

4. Fly Rod Raffle

Ticket sales have started for the 7wt TFO TiCRx with a total bought of 30 tickets for a sum of \$200 to date. Tickets are \$10/1 ticket, \$20/3 tickets and \$35/6 tickets. Paypal account should be added by November for the club to use for rod raffles and other events will be investigated to be used. The rod being raffled will be a 9' 7wt TFO TiCRx that was donated by the Rominger estate. The drawing will be held on 12/19 at the December leadership meeting and the winner will be announced after the meeting via email. 39 tickets have been sold to date. A spring rod raffle is being planned and final details will be determined at the January 2017 leadership meeting.

5. 2017 Academy Planning

Campbell High School has agreed to host the academy again. The proposed date is 3/25 with final confirmation occurring by the December leadership meeting. Advertising will begin in January. Matt and Steve to work out Paypal signup requirements and cost to use. The fee for adults is increasing by \$10 to \$85 and the youth fee is decreasing by \$10 to \$40. IFFF members will still receive a \$10 discount. Dick motioned to accept the Academy plans & pricing, Andy seconded.

- o The library is still limited on space after a thorough sorting following the Rominger estate additions.
