Attached is a photo of the collection of over 70 books, 10 DVD's and 10 VCR tapes. The collection ranges from some legendary historically significant books like Gary Borger's Nymphing, to Art Flick's Streamside Guide to great current books like George Daniel's Strip Strike, Pat Dorsey's Fly Fishing Tailwaters, and Rick Kustich's Fly Fishing Great Lakes Steelhead. There is a wonderful range of books on trout tactics, steelheading, rod building, insects, fly tying, and many other topics. Fly of the Month

The Home Invader

This is a Doug McKnight fly pattern, as tied by George Daniel on May 2nd, 2016.



Materials List:

Thread: 140 denier or 6/0

Hook: #2 Partridge Attitude

Conehead: black tungsten

Tail: white marabou tied on top and extending 1.5 hook shank lengths behind hook.

Body: hairline Senyo chromatic brush, tying it back and wrap all the way to the cone.

Collar: UV barred grizzly Senyo predator wrap, one wrap around the collar.

Whip finish. White, olive and black are George's favorite colors for this pattern. This simple tie is a very effective pattern for trout and other predatory fish.
