Presentation: Fly Fishing for Muskies



On **March 6**, **Joe Goodspeed**, Chief Product Designer for the prestigious Thomas and Thomas Fly Rod Company, will be visiting us to talk about **Fly Fishing For Muskies**. Joe is known for being a very diversified and innovative fly fisher who thinks outside the box and targets many different species.

His talks are always interesting, and this one will provide a comprehensive overview of the special flies, gear, and other equipment that make it possible to land, properly handle, and safely release these fish. Joe will share some of his successful fly patterns and the rigging tricks that have accounted for the successful catch and release of many adult muskies and tiger muskies on fly gear in heavily-fished public northeastern waterways over the past two seasons. There are many innovations being made in our sport today by folks like Joe, Blane Chocklett, and Rick Kustich, developing advances in equipment and techniques to take these tough fish consistently on a fly rod.

Prior to his presentation, Joe will be demonstrating one of his favorite musky flies. Joe has spoken at our club several times before and always has some interesting stories and innovative techniques to share, so you will not want to miss this presentation. Fly tying demo will start at 6:30 pm, with the presentation starting at 7:00, at the Big Flats Community Center, 476 Maple Street, Big Flats.

Many thanks to Richard Naylor and Vincent Leonard for taking care of the logistics arrangements.






Giving the Gift of IFFF Membership


Twin Tiers Five Rivers Chapter Library News










If you are an experienced fly tier, you might want to check out John Barr's book <u>Barr Flies</u> (B-B-5) or John Borski's DVD <u>Borski Ties Flies</u> (D-B-5).



The latest addition to the library is a book on CD entitled *A Steelheader's Way: Principles, Tactics and Techniques*, by Leni Waller. This is not your typical CD but rather a reading of the original book by the author. After reviewing the CD, I would recommend it for that long car ride to a warmer climate, for more than four hours of listening and learning. Pat's Rubber Legs Stone As tied by Sam Decker



Thread: 70 Denier Fluorescent Red Ultra

Hook: Size 4 Mustad #3665A or similar

Weight: Wrap entire hook shank with 0.030" dia. lead

To start body, tie in variegated chenille, gold & brown/black, at back of hook.

Legs: *Flexi Floss*. Tie in tail on top, fold back to make two tails. Then tie in middle legs, front legs and antenna, using figure 8 wraps to fasten legs.

To finish Body, carefully wrap chenille forward, making sure legs are placed where you want them as you go. Finish head and whip finish.

Klinkhammer As tied by Rodney Priddle



Hook: Daichi 1167 – size 12

Thread: Black

Tie in post of orange poly yarn so post is 90 degrees to hook shank. Post can also be white or chartreuse color.

Abdomen: Grey dubbing (can also use dun or cream color). Use very fine dubbing without guard hairs. Then tie a few wraps of peacock herl up to the post.

Hackle: Black or brown dry fly hackle, 1.5-2 times hook gap. Tie hackle up the post, then wrap it down the post to hook shank.

Rodney recommends keeping the post high, then trim to lower height if you want when you get to the water

Uncle Fester Isonychia Nymph As tied by Craig Buckbee



Hook: Daiichi 1120 or 1130 size #8 or #10

Head: 1/8" black bead

Tail: 6-8 brown hen neck hackle fibers, short length (size of hook gap)

Abdomen: Tie in red wire ribbing behind bead. Then tie in 3 fibers of peacock herl, inverting one length of herl (i.e. tie two fibers in at the narrow diameter end of the herl and tie the third at the thicker (opposite) end of the herl). Tie herl in at the back of the hook and wrap forward, then counter-wrap ribbing to lock in peacock herl. Wrapping the ribbing in the opposite direction that the herl was wrapped adds strength to the abdomen.

If you want to add stripe along the back to more accurately imitate the Iso nymph, use 20 lb test mono tied in at back and wrap red wire forward over the mono. (Craig ties his own without the stripe)

Thorax: Tie in a dubbing loop of mink fibers for the collar

Learn to Fly Fish in a Day

The TT5R Chapter of the International Federation of Fly Fishers is sponsoring its 10th Annual Fly Fishing Academy. This is a high-quality fly fishing course, open to Adults and to Youth 11 yrs old and over. The class will provide beginner fly fishers with the basic knowledge and skills to get started, and will help those familiar with the sport onto a fast track to improve.

Classroom topics include fly fishing equipment and its use, fly types and their usage, knot tying, reading water, basic entomology, fishing dry flies, streamers, and nymphs, catching and releasing fish. Students will most importantly develop fly casting skills through three sessions throughout the day.

Students can bring and learn on their own equipment, but are welcome to use the club's equipment.

More than 15 members and fly fishing experts staff the school, bringing over 200 years of fly fishing experience to help you learn and have fun. Kirk Klingensmith is our Lead Instructor for the Academy. Chas Elliott leads our fly casting staff and is an Internationally Certified Casting Instructor.



Class fee is \$85 for Adults (ages 16 and over) and \$40 for Youth (ages 11-15, accompanied by a registered Adult). TT5R Members are also eligible for a \$10 discount. Lunch and refreshments will be provided.


