Fly of the Month

Kreelex Fly

Fly Tying Recipe & Photos, compliments of Kirk Klingensmith

This fly was originated by Chuck Craft. It is a favorite of Chris Walker, former TTFR member and now a designer at Rio Fly Lines in Idaho Falls, ID. We fished this fly in Montana this summer with great success. It is very easy to tie.

It uses Kreinik Flash which is a crinkled flash material with additional fibers mixed in. (also sold under the Kreelex brand name) It is not as common as other flash material. I ordered mine from Mossy Creek Fly Shop (mossycreekflyfishing.com). Mike Hogue (TTFR member) carries it at Badger Creek Fly Tying, Freeville, NY. Field and Stream in Horseheads carries it, but didn't have the colors used here at last visit.

I will post instructional videos on our Facebook page. The fly below was tied by Chris Walker and is similar to what I tied at the September meeting.



<u>Hook</u>: - size 4 Gamatasku B10S, Mustad 3366 or Chris ties on Mustad 34007 (any standard length hook is preferred by Chris and myself) I tie a smaller version on size 6

Thread: 6/0 red

Eyes: 3/16" Gold Plated Brass or 1/40 to 1/30 oz Painted Lead Eye

<u>Tail</u>: Gold Kreinik flash (approx. 3" from eye to tip of tail)

Lower Wing: Copper Kreinik Flash (approx. 1 3/4" from eye to end of wing)

Upper wing: Copper Kreinik Flash

This fly can be tied in a variety of color combinations. I have tied it in Copper/Bronze (Tail/Wing) or Bronze/Bronze and caught smallmouth imitating crawfish. Pearl/Silver or all Pearl are good colors.
