Change a law ?

Jake Trimmer reports that the Chemung County Federation of Sportsmen’s Clubs is permitted to submit two resolutions pertaining to changes in the fish & wildlife laws to the NYS Conservation Council. Jake has guidelines for writing up resolutions and will work with anyone with an interest in suggesting a change. The resolutions are due by February 1, 2009, and the NYSCC will then lobby our legislature to enact the changes.

General meeting – December 1

The main feature this meeting was a DVD on fly casting. Several myths were dispelled and we learned some great exercises for practice casting. Some points emphasized were:

- 1) put the foot of your casting hand a step behind
- 2) put your thumb on the cork

- 3) don't twist your wrist
- 4) keep your elbow 'on the shelf', i.e. in a flat horizontal plane, throughout the cast.
- Dick Naylor was presented with a card and a nice shadow box filled with flies, in recognition of his many years of service as treasurer.
- John Lively demonstrated how to make a welded loop in the end of a fly line, using shrink wrap tubing.
- Updates were given on: the December 6th fly tackle sale, Marcellus Shale regulatory oversight, the library, and upcoming events.
- There were about a dozen members in attendance.

Business meeting – December 15

The monthly business meeting was held December 15. Kirk Klingensmith, Steve Harris, Dick Naylor, Jake Trimmer, John Lively, and Ken Aniolek attended.

- Treasury: Steve Harris reported an ending balance of \$3,221 in the club's bank account.
- Conservation: Options for making and placing new signs for local creeks were discussed.
- Programs: speakers set for Jan and Feb.
- Academy: Publicity plans were discussed.
- The Tom Kracji estate sale resulted in a \$700 cash donation to the club by Rosalie Krajci, along with a number of unsold items.
- Library: The merits of storing the library at the Community Center were discussed.
- Outreach: Opportunities at Bass Pro in March, and Ithaca Fly Fishing Day

Hook: Mustad 3366, size 4 or 6
 Thread: Yellow, size 3/0
 Tail: Chartreuse bucktail & yellow Crystal Flash
 Underbody: Yellow Ice Chenille or Estaz
 Overbody: Yellow 3 mm craft foam (doubled)
 Eyes: 4mm Fire Orange Doll Eyes

Our local chapter is the Twin Tiers Five Rivers chapter, named after the Canisteo, Chemung, Cohocton, Susquehanna, and Tioga Rivers in southern New York and northern Pennsylvania.
